Richmond: The Story Continues...

In the spring of this year "Richmond: An Introduction" opened to sold out crowds. During 4 weeks of performances we asked the audience "What stories remain untold? What is missing from this tale of Richmond? In "The Story Continues" we used the audience response to literally redesign the exhibit to reflect this dialog. New exhibits include Native American History, "Speakeasy Blues" and the History & Heroes of Richmond's Shoreline. In three of the exhibits we were asked to move deeper into stories including Richmond's Toxic Legacy, Latino History/Pride, and The Tent City Peace Movement. Designed by a host of area artists, this 10 room tour is an intimate and interactive journey into the life and times of Richmond. Tours are 1 hour in length with audience size limited to 18. *Reservations are required.*

Richmond: The Story Continues is sixth in a series of "community portraits" developed by this Boston-based nonprofit. The redesign of an entire community exhibit through dialog is a *programmatic first*. The Touchable Stories project series is created to develop dialog, bring art & artists into the neighborhoods and to use the exhibits to attract new resources to benefit the host community.

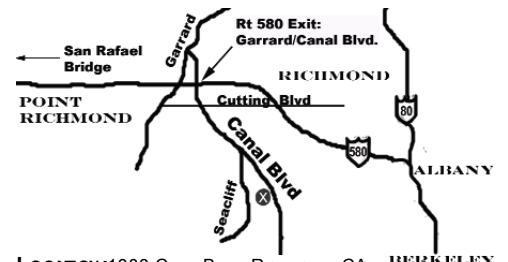
